Connection to Care™ Ensuring medicine access for low-income patients.

Connection to Care provides free access to Pfizer's leading medicines through your physician. Your physician must complete their portion of the application.

Who is eligible for Connection to Care?

To qualify for Connection to Care, you must satisfy the following criteria:

- Single household income must be \$19,000 or less; if married, household income must be \$31,000 or less
- You must not have any prescription drug coverage through private insurance or any public assistance programs.

How do I apply?

- Just click one of the buttons below to download an application or receive it through the mail
- Then fill out the Patient section of this form and ask your doctor to complete the Physician section
- Finally, mail in the completed form along with a copy of your tax return and prescription information

If the request is approved, an approval letter will be sent to you and your physician.

Keep in mind, you'll have to submit a copy of your tax return to verify eligibility only once a year, but to reapply for medications every 3 months.

How will I get my medicines?

After you and your physician are enrolled in the program, your medicine will arrive at your physician's office about 3 to 4 weeks. Generally, a 3-month supply is shipped to your physician's office. Simply pick up your medicine at your physician's office.

Getting started. Are you eligible?

The Together Rx Access™ Card has been created to help qualified individuals and families without prescription drug coverage to save on brand-name prescription drugs and other prescription products, as well as save on a wide range of generic drugs.

Please see the list below to check your eligibility. You must meet **all** the following criteria in order to be eligible.

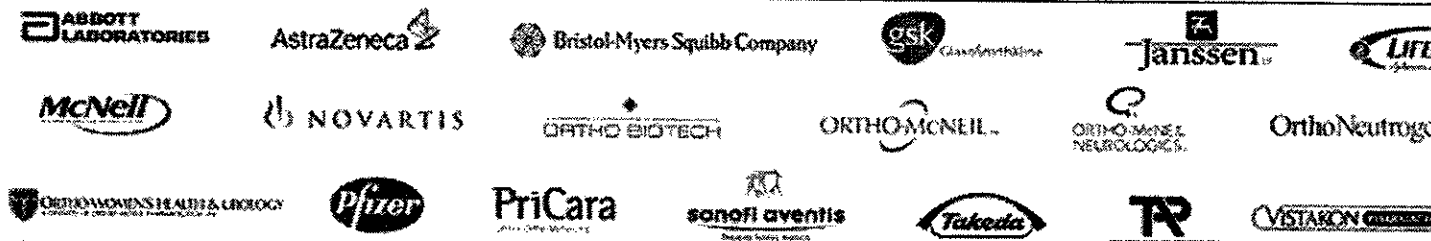
- Not eligible for Medicare
- No prescription drug coverage (public or private)
- Household income* equal to or less than:
 - \$30,000 for a single person
 - \$40,000 for a family of two
 - \$50,000 for a family of three
 - \$60,000 for a family of four
 - \$70,000 for a family of five
- Legal US resident

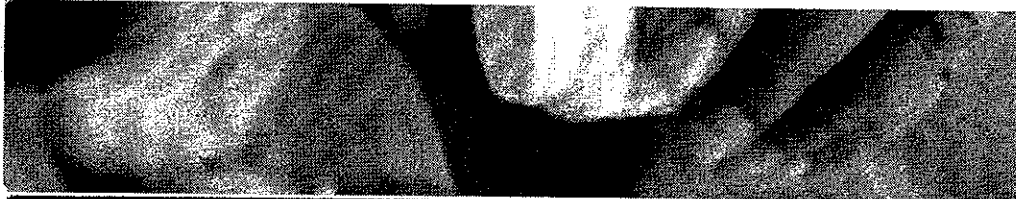

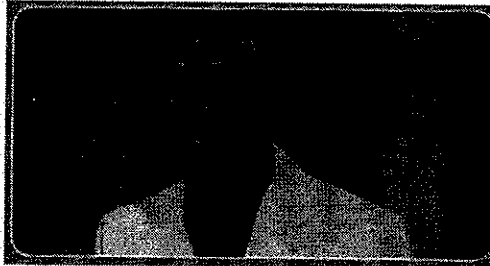

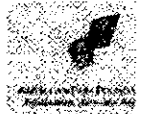
